AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 4-6-163 OF THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING THE PURPOSE OF THE ROTONDA LAKES STREET AND DRAINAGE UNIT TO INCLUDE BEAUTIFICATION PROJECTS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 125.01, Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida, has the authority to establish, merge, amend, or abolish municipal service benefit units; and

21 WHEREAS, the Board previously created the municipal service benefit unit known 22 as the Rotonda Lakes Street and Drainage Unit in Ordinance Number 97-014; and

WHEREAS, the Rotonda Lakes Street and Drainage Unit advisory board has requested funds derived from within the unit to be used for beautification projects, in addition to the existing purposes; and

WHEREAS, the expenditure of funds for the requested additional purposes is a valid public purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 4-6-163, Purpose, of Article IX, Chapter 4-6 of the code of laws and ordinances of Charlotte County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4-6-163. Purpose.

The purpose of the unit is to provide for the construction, reconstruction, repair. paving, repaving, hard-surfacing, re-hard surfacing, widening, guttering, and draining, of streets, bridges and related drainage facilities in the unit, and of necessary appurtenances and accessory structures thereto located within or without the unit, and beautification projects including landscaping, lighting, and community signs, from funds derived from special assessments within the unit.

Section. 2 Severability. In the event any portion of the foregoing conflicts with any other Charlotte County Code or other applicable law, the more restrictive shall apply. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of these sections is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, district, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the chapter.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon its filing with the Department of State

Police officer hiring in US increases in 2023 after years of decline, survey shows

PHILADELPHIA - Police departments across the United States are reporting an increase in their ranks for the first time since the COVID 19 pandemic and the 2020 killing of George Floyd, which led to a historic exo-dus of officers, a survey

shows. More sworn officers were hired in 2023 than in were bired in 2023 than in any one of the previous four years, and fewer officers overall resigned or retired, eccording to the 214 law enforcement agencies that responded to a survey by the Police Executive Research Forum, or PERR Floyds death at the hands of Minnespo-

hands of Minneapo-lis police officers spurred na poince officers pured nationwide protests against police brutality and heightened scrutiny of law enforcement. As more and more offi-cers left, many of the departments had to rede-

ploy stretched resources by shifting officers away from lovestigative work or quality of life issues such as abandoned whicles or potential inner to an it. noise violations to handle increases in crime and, in some cases, the shortages some cases, the shortages meant slower response times or limiting responses to emergencies only, police officials say.

"I just think that the past

This think that the past four years have been particularly challenging for American policing," said Chuck Wexler, executive director of PBRB, a nonprofit policing think tank based in Washington, D.C. "And our survey shows we're finally starting to

turn a corner."
Individual departments are turning that corner at different rates, however, according to Wexler, who noted many are still strug-

gling to attract and keep officers.

As a whole, the profes-sion "isn't out of the woods yet," he said.

than 5% below their staff-inglevels from that time, even with a year-over-year increase from 2022 to 2023. The survey also showed smaller departments with fewer than 50 officers are still struggling with a higher rate of resignations and retirements.

The survey asked only for numbers, Wexler said, so it's hard to say whether those officers are leavthose officers are leaved in a comparison of leaving the profession altogether. He also sald amaller departments, which account for 80% of agencies

nstionwide, were underrep-resented in the responses PERF received.
Many larger departments have increased offering energy source payor started offering increases, the rate of features are the proposed for the incentives such as signing bonuses for experienced officers who are willing to transfer, something smaller departments can it really compete with. At least a dozen smaller departments have disbanded, leaving the municipalities they once arrived to rely on state or county help for policing. But even some of the highest-paying large departments are still struggling to get new hires in the door.

"I don't think it's all about "Idon't think it's all about the money. I think it's about the way people perceive their job and feel they are going to be supported," Wealer said, "You have West Coast departments that are pay-ing six figures, but still see-ing major challenges in hir-ing."

Tensions were already high after USC canceled a planned commence-ment speech by the school's pro-Palestinian valedicto-rian, ciling safety concerns.
