AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, EXTENDING
THE STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO HURRICANE IAN.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2022, Hurricane Ian made landfall causing loss of life and extensive damage to property, infrastructure, and other facilities in Charlotte County; and

WHEREAS, the damage caused by Hurricane Ian poses a serious and continuing threat to public health, life, and safety; and

WHEREAS, the emergency mitigation of, response to and recovery from the effects of Hurricane Ian necessitate the continuation of the declaration of a state of local emergency in Charlotte County such that the powers available to local governments under Chapter 252, Florida Statutes shall remain in effect; and

WHEREAS, Charlotte County Code Section 2-1-43 provides that the County Administrator may take all necessary actions to address the emergency when, as is the case here, a quorum of the Board of County Commissioners is unable to timely convene, and provides for the procedure and formalities otherwise required by law to be waived.

WHEREAS, an emergency exists such that the immediate enactment of this resolution pursuant to Section 2-1-43, Charlotte County Code, is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, of Charlotte County, Florida:

Section 1. The state of emergency declared on September 26, 2022 by Resolution 2022-115 and extended thereafter, is hereby extended for an additional seven (7) days

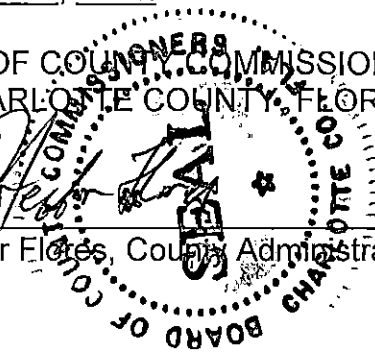
from the effective date of this Resolution, unless terminated or modified earlier or extended in accordance with law.

Section 2. All emergency powers authorized by the September 26, 2022 Resolution declaring a local state of emergency and any extensions are hereby retained and continued for the duration of this Resolution.
