A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY, FLORIDA EXTENDING A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING FOR EMERGENCY GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS RELATED TO AN EF1 TORNADO.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida issued a Resolution declaring a local state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis signed Executive Order 22-17 declaring that a State of Emergency exists in Charlotte County; and

WHEREAS, Charlotte County Code Section 2-1-43 provides that the County Administrator may take all necessary actions to address the emergency when, as is the case here, a quorum of the Board of County Commissioners is unable to timely convene, and provides for the procedure and formalities otherwise required by law to be waived.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the emergency power vested in the County pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 2-1 of the Charlotte County Code of Ordinances, it is hereby proclaimed that:

1. The local state of emergency declared on January 17, 2022 is hereby extended for an additional 7 days from the effective date of this Resolution, unless terminated or modified earlier or extended in accordance with law.


2. All emergency powers authorized by the Resolution of January 17, 2022, declaring a local state of emergency is hereby retained and continued for the duration of this Resolution.


