





Public Safety

A new Marine Rescue and firefighting vessel purchased through Impact Fees. The new boat is a 27-foot Boston Whaler with a 650 GPM pump. Marine 2 will be based at Lashley Marina and will be the primary emergency response vessel for Charlotte Harbor and the Peace River. Additionally, Marine 2 responds in support of Marine 1 in the ICW, Gulf Island and the Gulf of Mexico.




2012 Highlights

Water Resources

Utilities successfully obtained the Babcock Consumptive Water Use Permit for a secondary Public Water Supply with a Maximum-Monthly allocation of 93 MG and 372 MG annually issued by SFWMD on December 21, 2011.


The Regional Integrated Loop System Phase 1A (Punta Gorda) Interconnect project was substantially completed and water service connections were activated.

Bio-Recycling Center

The Florida of Environmental Protection (FDEP) has issued a permit to SYNAGRO for the construction and operation of the Charlotte County Bio-Recycling Center at the Zemel Road Landfill. This will be a regional facility for the treatment of biosolids (composting). SYNAGRO's treatment of the biosolids will produce an AA-rated product. The facility will consist of a 90,000 square foot active-phase "windrow" composting area under two pre-engineered fabric covered buildings that will allow for up to 14 windrows. Windrow composting is the production of compost by piling organic matter or biodegradable waste in long rows or windrows. These rows are then turned to improve porosity and oxygen content. The SYNAGRO facility will also include a 50,000 square foot curing area and will be operated by three employees. Construction is scheduled to begin this summer.

Solar Lighting
