Discussion and direction on the 2026 Sales Tax Projects list.

Deputy County Administrator Emily Lewis gave a brief overview of How are Projected Selected, 2026 Sales Tax Timeline, Ten Year Program - Tier 1 Projects, Ten Year Program - Tier 2 Projects, Fifteen Year Program - Tier 1, Fifteen Year Program - Tier 2, Twenty Year Program - Tier 1, Twenty Year Program - Tier 2, responded to Babcock Master Development Order (MDO), Ordinance language, program project reprioritization and flexibility, alternative financing mechanisms, vetting process, Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) sheets, estimate project size and costs, budget process, Sports Field Conversions, Parks Master Plan, Fire Station 8 Replacement, Tringali Park Recreation Center Replacement, approval rating, Charlotte Sports Park funding qualification debt service requirement, 2020 Sales Tax Program, property acquisition, and Burnt Store Road Area East-West Connector.

Travis Perdue, Facilities Construction and Maintenance Director gave a brief overview of Charlotte County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) Hangar, CCSO District 6, replied to Master Space Plan, spatial utilization, Fire Station 8 Replacement, and estimated project costs.

Tommy Scott, Community Services Director gave a brief overview of Sport Field Conversions, Tringali Park Recreation Center Replacement, West County Community Library, Burnt Store Regional Park, Park Restrooms, Bicycle, Pedestrian Trails, and Sidewalks, Park Renovations, Englewood 775 Community Park, Sport Field Conversions - Convert 2 fields from natural turf to artificial turf, responded to spatial constraints and turf maintenance process and cost comparison.

Chief Matthew McElroy, Public Safety Director gave a brief overview of Fire Station 1 Replacement, Animal Services Building, Fire Station 8 Replacement, and Fire Station 7 Replacement.

Assistant County Administrator Claire Jubb gave a brief overview of Water Quality Improvements, replied to Babcock MDO fire station requirements and Increment population thresholds, impact fee funding and reimbursements, Fire Station 9, and design cost share.

**Chair Tiseo** discussed service level determination and site selection process, population thresholds, fire station construction and design costs, Tier 1 Projects, affordability, cost responsibility, Fifteen Year Program - Tier 1, Englewood Fire District, West County representation, CCSO District 6, CCSO Master Plan and spatial design, Metro Forecasting, Sports Field Conversions, Harold Avenue Park sports field expansion options, Fire Station 1 Replacement, Fire Station 8 Replacement, Tringali Park Recreation Center Replacement, program length and extension, infrastructure improvements, project acceleration and management team expansion, flexibility, Burnt Store Road Area East-West Connector, and property tax bill savings. **Commissioner Constance** mentioned impact fees, fire station cost responsibility, program term extension, project reprioritization, South County Regional Park Pool upsizing, tourism and economic impacts, sporting events, Englewood Fire District, Sarasota County funding contribution, timing, Fifteen Year Program - Tier 1, Fire Station 8 Replacement, program length, Edgewater Drive, traffic pattern impacts and improvements, Harborview Road, Bermont Road, Cultural Center commitment, inflation, and Burnt Store Road Area East-West Connector. **Commissioner Deutsch** commented on Sport Field Conversions - Convert 2 fields from natural turf to artificial turf, maintenance cost comparison, program length, debt service reduction, Murdock Village, and Charlotte Sports Park. **Commissioner Doherty** noted Fifteen Year Program - Tier 1, Englewood Fire District, funding contribution, program flexibility, CCSO District 6, program length, Twenty Year Program - Tier 1, Twenty Year Program - Tier 2, financing mechanisms, tax payer and community benefits, cost savings, efficiency, Cultural Center, Capital Needs Assessment (CNA), and CIP. **Commissioner Truex** spoke to population threshold, project delay and reprioritization, Englewood Fire District, Sarasota County funding contribution and alternative sources, Fifteen Year Program - Tier 1, West County representation, Representative Danny Nix appropriation support, CCSO District 6, approved developments, Fire Station 8 Replacement, Code changes, and Englewood 775 Community Park.
