Indian Spring marker update

- Location of marker has been moved as it was originally on someone's plot

Bunk House update

- Brief refresher on the history of the Bunk House for our new member, Deborah Finch
- Full-structural analysis and preservation report has been received and will go before the BCC for review. They will determine what happens with the restoration of the Bunk House moving forward
- HAC would like to review the report Jennifer will check on ordinance and privacy concerns to see if a copy could be distributed to the HAC
- There was a previous effort to raise funds for the restoration by the Historical Society
- There are layers of construction over time, so a determination on what time period to restore it to will need to be made
- There is debate about moving the Bunk House to Placida

Hotel Punta Gorda marker update

- Hotel PG marker (located in the historic district) was destroyed by lan, at which point Jennifer reached out to the City Clerk. It was determined a sign permit and certificate of appropriateness was required in order to replace the marker.
- Jennifer circled back with the City Clerk recently and has yet to hear back.

El Jobean marker update

- El Jobean marker was damaged in August when the Bean Depot was closed
- Facilities checked the marker and stated the bell piece is gone
- Jennifer has started the process of ordering a new marker

New Point Comfort marker update

- Marker will be done in January, which is the 100th anniversary of Stanley Lampp first plotting New Point Comfort
- HAC is invited to the unveiling No date at this time

- Theresa stated the History Center has announced that they are honoring a few different people including the first Presbyterian church in Punta Gorda and the CARES organization.
- Stephen stated the Military Museum is working with the school board to up the grade level of historical learning. The Punta Gorda Historical Society received a \$10,000 which will be going to the Women's Club to finish their kitchen. The Historical Park has rented out all of the cottages. The Wildlife Center has broken ground and there will be ways to navigate between there and the Historic Park. They are rebranding from "Farmer's Market" to "Artisan Market"

- Katherine stated the Hickory Bluff Chapter is maintain the Keep Charlotte Beautiful at the Hickory Bluff Cemetery. She has mentioned getting an informational board for the cemetery, to compliment the two or three cement markers Jennifer will inquire with. A statue and bench were donated, and they received two grants as well. Jennifer recommended doing a ground-penetrating radar before placing anything else in the cemetery. Katherine also stated they received approval from the County and the Daughter's of the American Revolution to install a marker at the William R. Gaines park in February
- Stephen stated the Liberty Tree marker is hard to see. He will send a photo to Jennifer
- Deborah asked about replacing the single piece that's missing from the El Jobean marker, rather than replacing the whole thing. Jennifer clarified that it is all cast together and cannot be replaced
