2. Roll Call by Jane Ravello

3. Division Reports

March 2026 – While the members looked over the reports, they all agreed they were okay.

4. Old Business

- Hurricane Recovery:
Still waiting on the Event Center Army Corp seawall permitting; Bayshore Live Oak Park grass area we are changing out the grass and putting in pavers where the grass will grow in between, the Board approved the contract to start in April and should be finished by Sept.; The seawall at Bayshore collapsed at the newer bathroom we are working on the construction paperwork; we are working on Flag poles should be completed by the 1st of October. Bid documents for the boardwalks should be done in the next few weeks and then we can start working on those. Port Charlotte Boat Ramp is being looked on the design then hoped to be ready by September; the Englewood Beach Boardwalk we are in permit right now; Placida Fishing Pier the board gave us directions on the most resilient walkway which we are working on design now. El Jobean Fishing Pier is being worked on the design and should be done by Sept., then they move on to construction documents. Bayshore Live Oak Park- we are working through phases in designs and hope to be done by March 2027. Boca Grande expects to be finished with in July, then on to construction documents. PCB Floating dock, pier and boardwalk Board approved the design contract and hope to have that done in April next year. Anger fishing pier is in design and hopes to be completed by this December. Englewood Beach Basketball courts are in repair and hope to be done by July.

5. **New Business**

Spring Training Recap – Maureen asked anyone get a chance to go to a game this year – Yes, of course. Maureen gave her Summary out to everyone. The total revenue for 2026 Spring Training Season was \$4,680,000. The total estimated economic impact for the 2025 Spring Training Season was \$9,454,900. Total operational expenses for Spring Training 2026 were \$529,921.87. Included in these expenses were security operations, CCSO, Waste Management, and Fire/EMS. Total number of Staffing Hours were 19,383.50 (17,811.5 hours in straight-time and 1,572 hours in overtime.)

NACPRO Awards – Charlotte County Government for the Community Inventory Project in Recognition of Outstanding Achievement in the Field of Parks and Recreation. And Charlotte County Government for the Lake Betty Park Redevelopment starting on our Master Plan 1st phase is a new playground and Ninja Warrior trails, and next we are expanding the Restroom area and Walking Paths and minor playground areas.

PCB fee Discussion with PRAB – Tommy is presenting to you and it will go to the Board as well, the Revamping our fee schedule since we have a brand-new building in the works and we have to check with other venues in other areas to get an idea since our building is bigger than we had before. After discussing all the plans for fees Maria Greenberg made a motion for this Fee Schedule to go to the Board with a second motion by Erick Toth.

6. **Sports Council Update** - Erick Toth – We went over the normal facility questions and answers, I reviewed the concession stands and upkeep and reminding the staff of things to do. I went through field scheduling, getting Kristian Kallesten up to par as he is new, reviewed all the scheduling for the summer clubs, we did meet Robin Schilb who is the Crime Prevention through the Environmental design person, which is the liaison between the Parks and Recreation and CCSO, to increase their presence, we've had some vandalism in Ann Dever Fields that left a mess. If you see anything going on, please make sure to report it.

8. **Director's Report** – Tommy introduced our new Recreation Superintendent – Miriam Sota for West County and we want to let you know this is the best Advisory Board in Charlotte County.
