

## Reserve Policy

#### **II.** Municipal Service Benefit Units

The components of Municipal Service Benefit Units reserves should include, but not be limited to the following:

#### a. Reserve for Contingencies

The purpose of reserve for contingencies is to maintain adequate levels of fund balance to mitigate current and future risks such as revenue shortfalls, unanticipated expenditures, and to ensure stable tax rates; and other unforeseen financial situations after exhausting all other funding options. The county should strive to maintain a balance not less than 5% and not greater than 10% percent of the total of the budget. Budget is defined as the amount available to spend to include beginning balance and revenues.

#### b. Cash Carried Forward

A reserve amount for the purpose of paying expenses from Oct. 1 of the ensuing fiscal year until the time when the revenues for that year are expected to be available. The county should strive to maintain a balance not less than 5% or greater than 10% percent of the total revenue receipts and balances (beginning balance) of the budget.

#### c. Future Capital Outlay

Any reserve amount accumulated for the purpose of funding capital projects must be spent on such project within six years from the date it was assessed or collected.





The Board of County Commissioners adopted the final assessment resolution on July 17, 2025, with a max rate of \$292 to fund the paving program, removing the sidewalk capital improvement project (CIP) while directing staff to review the proposed Public Works services work program.

- Staff based future work programs on FY24 actual expenditures and current service requests.
- Staff reduced activities under Public Works Services for right-of-way watering, road edging, striping, legends and markings, reflective pavement markers, shoulder repairs, side lot outfall maintenance, and right-of-way clearing and hauling.







#### Options:

- 1. Retain Approved FY26 Rate at \$300.00.
  - Defer dredge project to next 2-yr budget cycle (FY28) and continue building reserves for future dredging. Reserves will need to be used for dredging by FY29.
- 2. Reduced FY26 Rate at \$132.00.
  - Remove dredge project from 6-yr Capital Maintenance Program (CMP) and use current reserves for bathymetric surveying and navigational trimming. Bring dredge project back with an associated rate increase in a future budget cycle.

#### Options:

- 1. Retain Approved FY26 Rate at \$310.00 for exterior dredge.
  - No loan with a rate reduction in FY27. Anticipated rate reduction to \$60 upon completion of the exterior dredge; or \$150 in FY27 to build reserves for a future interior dredge. (Advisory Board recommended a rate of \$150 in FY27.)
- 2. Reduce FY26 Rate to maintain current FY25 Rate of \$100.00 for exterior dredge.
  - Requires a 3 year loan with either a rate increase in FY30 for an interior dredge or decrease in FY30 for no interior dredge.

33 Max Rate: \$310.00

<sup>\*</sup> This is not the recommendation of staff based on feedback from the Advisory Board and citizens in attendance at the July 2025 public hearing requesting additional interior dredging. This option would postpone a future dredge project until the loan is paid off.
